Mary JONES Charity Book

In the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset.

December 1892.

Copy of the first page of the old Register & Record of the said Charity:

*High Littleton Church
December 10th 1793.*

*"Whereas Mary JONES late of Stowey in the County of Somerset, Single woman deceased, in & by her last Will and Testament dated the 18th of January 1787, gave and bequeathed unto Henry Hippisley COXE Esq'r, of Ston Easton in the said County, Richard PAGET, of Chilcompton in the said County, Esq'r, and Jacob MOGG of High Littleton in the same County, Esq'r, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds, to be paid by her Executors therein named, at the expiration of six months next after her decease, **Upon Trust** that they should immediately vest the same in some or other of the Public Funds, and receive and pay the Dividends and produce thereof to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of High Littleton for the time being, to be by them, and the Minister of the said Parish, applied, distributed, paid and disbursed to or for the use of the Poor necessitous Persons in the said Parish at their discretion; and **Whereas** the said Mary JONES by a codicil to her said Will, dated 26th of April 1791, charged certain Tenements & Hereditaments thereby devised by her with the payment of the said sum of Five Hundred Pounds upon the Trusts in the said Will mentioned, and thereby discharged the Executors of her said Will from the Payment thereof, whereby the Charitable intentions of the said Mary JONES in favor of the said Parish became liable to be defeated. **But** Dame Elizabeth JONES, Widow of Sir William JONES, late of Ramsbury Manor in the County of Wilts., Baronet deceased (one of the Devisees and Legatees named in such Will), being desirous that such intentions should be carried into execution, did voluntarily pay the said sum of Five Hundred Pounds of her own proper monies, to the said Henry Hippisley COXE, Richard PAGET and Jacob MOGG, for the purpose of being laid out or invested by them in some of the Public Funds upon such Trusts as aforesaid. **And Whereas** the said Henry Hippisley COXE, Richard PAGET, and Jacob MOGG, have invested the said sum of Five Hundred Pounds by the purchase of Five Hundred and thirty-two pounds, nine shillings and ten pence, Three per cent consolidated Bank Annuities, and have by a certain deed bearing date the sixth day of July one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, declared the uses thereof according to the intention of the original Donor the said Mary JONES, deceased."*

It appears that during the last hundred years new Trustees have been appointed from time to time in consequence of deaths among their number, but no complete list has been preserved as far as is at present known. Legal charges however in connection with such new appointments appear in the accounts for the years following 1811, 1830, 1843 & 1846.

The last Trustees were John REES MOGG of High Littleton, Esq'r [*died 1880*],
John George MOGG of Farrington Gurney, Esq'r [*died 1885*],
John Usticke SCOBELL of Hallatrow, High Littleton, Esq'r [*died 1883*]
and Rev'd Henry Hodges MOGG formerly of High Littleton, Clerk.

In 1891 on the death of the Rev'd Edmund Crane STREETEN, and on the appointment of the Rev'd Ambrose Millett FOSTER to the Vicarage of High Littleton, only one of the above Trustees was living, namely, The Rev'd Henry Hodges MOGG of Newbridge Hill, Bath, and as he was in weak health & well advanced in years [*he died in 1894*], it was suggested to him that it might be well to take legal steps for the appointment of new Trustees. After correspondence & consultation between Rev. H.H. MOGG & the Administering Trustees, namely the Churchwardens, the Overseers & the Vicar of High Littleton, and on the advice of Messrs REES-MOGG & DAVY, Solicitors of Cholwell, Temple Cloud, it was decided to transfer the capital sum of the Charity from Private Trustees to the public Charity Commissioners, and this transference was duly executed in December 1891.

1891.

In December 1891 The Administering Trustees proceeded to order Blankets for distribution before the Transference referred to on the previous page had been completed, and expended more than the Funds afterwards transferred to their use would meet; for it was found that the first quarter's dividend in each year had been usually applied to the payment for Blankets distributed at the end of the previous year. It was thought well however in future to make up the accounts to the end of each year & to expend only the dividends which had been received in that year. In order however to bring matters into regular order the balance expended was met

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by a special Donation. The accounts therefore stand as on the opposite page, and the names of the recipients of the Blankets are written on the following pages.

1892 - Mrs Mary JONES' Charity, High Littleton, Somerset.

Messrs REES MOGG & DAVY, Solicitors of Cholwell, Temple Cloud, sent in their Bill of Costs in connection with the transfer of the Capital Fund of this Charity from private trust to the Charity Commission, together with an intimation from the Charity Commission Office that the Trustees might pay it out of the income of the Charity. Accordingly their Bill of Costs amounting to £4. 4. 0 was paid on Dec'r 13th.

The total amount received was £13.19. 5, but in consequence of the above payment, a less sum than usual was available for the purchase of Blankets. The Administering Trustees thought that it would be well to give about the same number of Blankets as usual & therefore purchased rather cheaper Blankets supplied by Messrs EALAND of Bath. [Notice dated December 22nd 1892 states that the Blankets will be distributed in High Littleton School Room on Saturday Dec'r 24th at 12 noon.]

1893 - Mrs Mary JONES's Charity, High Littleton, Somerset.

During the Autumn of this year the Colliers of this Parish were out of work for more than four months, owing to the general dispute in the Coal trade. In consequence of the distress which accompanied this lack of work, the Administering Trustees decided to give away as many blankets as possible, and to distribute them before the Winter began instead of waiting until Christmas.

After careful examination & comparison of sample Blankets sent from three houses of business, the order was placed with Messrs EALAND & Co. of Bath.

The Blankets were distributed in High Littleton Schoolroom at noon on Saturday November 25th 1893. A List of the Recipients is written on pages 14 & 15 [*Numbers refer to the original book*].

Mrs Mary JONES's Charity.

The Local Government Act 1894 came into operation before the next administration of this Charity. On Dec'r 4th 1894 a Parish Council was appointed for High Littleton. The Parish Council assuming that this Charity was not an Ecclesiastical Charity but that it came under the provisions of the Loc. Gov't Act, section xiv paragraph 2, held a Special Council Meeting on January 15th 1895, and appointed the following four persons as Trustees of the Charity in the place of the two Overseers & two Churchwardens.

- Mr Thomas BLANNING, Farmer, Hallatrow.
- Mr Alfred Enos FREE, Stone Mason, Hallatrow.
- Mr Tho's EVANS, Collier, High Littleton.
- Mr H'y CHIVERS, Collier, Mearns.

These, being properly constituted Administering Trustees, with the Minister of the Parish ex officio, met at the Vicarage on (Tuesday January 22nd 1895 ?) [sic]. After inspecting & comparing Sample Blankets they determined to place an order with Messrs PRYCE JONES & Co. for 28 pairs of blankets.

They then spent a long time in considering the cases of "poor necessitous persons" in the Parish, & after reference to the lists of past years it was decided that the Persons whose names are written on pages 18 & 19 should be the recipients for the Winter of 1894-5. A list [dated Jan 28th 1895] was posted by the Schoolroom door. The Blankets were distributed in the Schoolroom [at 12.15 p.m.] on Wednesday, January 30th 1895.

Mrs Mary JONES' Charity, 1896.

In accordance with Loc. Gov't Act 1894 Section xiv paragraph 7 a meeting of the Parish Council was held on Weds. Nov. 18th 1896, at which lots were cast for the Retirement of two of the first four Administering Trustees elected on Jan 15th 1895; the names of those drawn for retirement were Messrs Tho's EVANS & Alfred Enos FREE. The Parish Council then proceeded to refill the vacancies thus occasioned. Mr Charles CHARD was elected & Mr Tho's EVANS was re-elected. The Names therefore of the Administering Trustees now are:

- Mr Thomas BLANNING, Farmer, Hallatrow.
- Mr Henry CHIVERS, Collier, Mearns.
- Mr Charles CHARD, Shoemaker, High Littleton.

A meeting of the Administering Trustees was held at the Vicarage on Monday Nov. 23rd.

Mr BLANNING was not present.

It was arranged to invite Messrs John HEAL & Son, Mr J.A. APPLEBY, Messrs EALAND & Co., & Messrs PRYCE JONES & Messrs FOX Bros. & Co. to submit sample blankets. A careful consideration of the circumstances etc. of all the Cottagers in the Parish was then gone into, and a preliminary list of recipients for the season was prepared.

A meeting of the Administering Trustees was also held at the Vicarage on Monday Dec. 7th 1896 when Blankets were examined and an order for 29 pairs of Blankets was placed with Mr APPLEBY of Temple Cloud; and the list of recipients was revised. A few days afterwards Mr APPLEBY wrote to explain that he had made a mistake in marking the Blankets & that the sample chosen should have been marked 11/- instead of 10/- a pair. It was felt by the Trustees to be better not to keep him to his price which would have involved him in pecuniary loss, & so sample Blankets were again asked for.

On Wednesday Dec'r 16th the Trustees again met & after comparing the sample Blankets placed an order for 29 pairs at 10/- with Messrs John HEAL & Son of Paulton. These Blankets were duly supplied & distributed in the Schoolroom [at 12 o'clock noon] on Saturday December 26th & a list of the recipients is given on page 26 & 27. (signed) Ambrose M. FOSTER, Sec.

Sample Blankets had been sent by those invited to do so, and after careful examination & comparison, a Blanket at 9/9 per pair submitted by the Cooperative & Industrial Society was selected, and it was agreed to order 27 pairs.

The List of Recipients was then revised & confirmed. It was resolved to distribute the Blankets in the N. School at 2.30 p.m. on Saturday December 19th.
