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GENERAL HISTORY OF TITHES

The word tithe means a tenth part of anything, but is most commonly used to refer to a tenth part of the produce and crops of parishioners, due, under Canon Law, to the incumbent of their parish for his support. The system of tithes goes back to at least the eighth century in England and for many centuries, every parishioner of a tithable parish contributed one tenth of his crops, animal offspring, animal produce and trade products to the rector, who would store it, where appropriate, in his tithe barn.

During the Middle Ages, pious people would give property and money to monasteries and other religious houses. Some persons, in whose gift it was, gave the rectory of a parish, which would then provide a regular annual income, in kind, to the monastery. Having received the rectory, the monastery would ensure that the pastoral needs of the parish were taken care of, by appointing a parish priest, called a vicar (from the latin word for a substitute). An Act of 1391 obliged monastic rectors to use part of their tithes for the relief of the poor of the parish.

When the Monasteries were dissolved by Henry VIII in 1538, many rectories (rectorships) passed into the royal hands. These were subsequently sold or otherwise granted to laymen and the lay rectors were then said to have "impropriated" the tithes. However, with the rectorial tithes, passed the responsibility for repairing the chancel of the Church and whoever was the owner of the tithes for the time being bore this Common Law liability.

There were two sorts of tithes, Great Tithes and Small Tithes. The former consisted of corn, hay, wood and fruit. Everything else was classed as Small. These were sub-classified as predial tithes - produce from the ground, personal tithes - profit from labour and mixed tithes, being a bit of each, such as dairy produce, chickens, lambs etc. Tithes of young animals were often called crying tithes. It became common for monastic rectors to give the Small (or Vicarial) Tithes to the vicar, although in many cases a pension or salary was paid instead.

Tithes were not always easy to collect and in the seventeenth century, several non-conformist groups vehemently opposed the payment of tithes to laymen as well as Church of England clergy. George FOX, not only forbade Quakers to pay tithes, but also urged them to dissuade others from paying. This was the cause of many Quakers being imprisoned.

Tithes were originally paid in kind, which, in the early days, when coinage was scarce, was a convenient form of currency. However, as time passed it became less and less convenient for the recipient of tithes to be burdened with a sudden inflow of livestock and produce at certain times of the year, much of which would inevitably have to be sold at market. Accordingly, private arrangements were made, whereby a larger portion of one sort of produce was paid in lieu of something else, or cash was paid instead of kind. This was called a "modus". Sometimes these arrangements were made by private Acts of Parliament and sometimes in a less formal manner, which on occasions resulted in legal action, when a tithe payer insisted on paying in kind, whilst the owner of the tithes claimed there was a modus, or vice versa. Strictly speaking, a modus was a composition existing since time immemorial, i.e. from before 1189.

From the seventeenth century onwards, numerous local Inclosure Acts were passed, as communal agriculture gave way to individual landholdings. Under these Acts, it was usual for the tithes to be commuted, by the allotment of land to the owner of the tithes or by the creation of rentcharges called corn rents.

Although Tithes were an intangible asset, a value could be attributed to them and the Impropriators were liable to pay Poor Rates on the annual value of the Tithes, in the same way that lessees and lifeholders were on the value of the land and houses they occupied. Where Poor Rates were levied on acreage, the value of the Tithes was translated into a notional acreage and the Impropriators charged accordingly. However, unlike occupiers of land, Impropriators do not appear to have been liable to payment of Church Rates on their Tithes.

Tithes were a good investment and as such could be sold for many times the annual income or even leased out for a period of years.

Under Common Law, if a piece of land and the tithes or rentcharge on that same land were vested in the same person, at the same time and in the same right, then the tithe or rentcharge was extinguished by "merger". Thereafter no further tithes were paid on that land.

Payment of tithes in kind was finally ended by the Tithe Commutation Act of 1836, under which all tithes were commuted into an annual rentcharge. Commissioners fixed a yearly amount which each plot of land was to bear, known as the commuted value. However, the actual amount payable was based on the average prices of wheat, barley and oats for the previous seven years and thus varied from year to year, reflecting the prosperity or otherwise of agriculture. Tithe rentcharges were payable by the occupiers rather than owners of land.

Under the 1836 Act, a professional survey and valuation was made of every tithable parish in the country, an exercise which took many years to complete. A large scale map was drawn for the parish, showing parish boundaries, roads, rivers, houses, gardens, fields and a reference number for each property. Accompanying the Tithe Map was the Tithe Award, which contained details of the Tithe Commissioners' assessment of the commuted amount of tithe on each property and to whom it was payable. The Schedules forming part of the Award, listed in approximately alphabetical order, for each separate piece of land and premises, the name of the owner, the occupier, the Tithe Map reference number, the name and description of lands and premises, state of cultivation, acreage, the amount of rentcharge apportioned and the impropriators to

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whom payable and a note of any land where the tithe has been merged. Three copies of the Tithe Award were made, one for the incumbent, one for the bishop and one was retained by the Tithe Commissioners. The records resulting from the 1836 legislation provide a parish by parish "Domesday Book" of land occupation and ownership.

The liability for payment of tithes was transferred from occupier to land owner under the Tithe Act of 1891, which no doubt, meant rents being raised to compensate. The Tithe Act of 1918 allowed, with certain restrictions, landowners to redeem the tithes on their land, on payment of a lump sum, calculated according to the method laid down in the Act.

The Tithe Act of 1925 stabilised the amount of tithes payable. For every £100 commuted value of tithe rentcharge, £105 became payable, regardless of the price of corn, which hitherto had affected the amount payable. In the case of rentcharges payable to the Church, rather than laymen, the amount payable was fixed at £109 10/- per £100, the additional sum being paid into a sinking fund, which at the end of a certain period would generate sufficient income to replace the rentcharge and so allow it to be extinguished.

The actual collection of tithes had always been a burden to tithe owners, who often had to resort to the courts to collect what was due to them. The Tithe Act of 1936 extinguished all tithe rentcharges with effect from 2nd October 1936. Under this Act, land formerly charged with a tithe rentcharge payable to the tithe owner was charged with a Tithe Redemption Annuity payable to the Crown. This was payable by the landowner to the Inland Revenue. The amount of the Annuities were £91 11 2 per £100 commuted value of rentcharge on agricultural land and £105 per £100 on non-agricultural land. These Annuities were to be payable for 60 years and then cease, but they were actually terminated prematurely under the Finance Act of 1977.

Tithe owners were compensated by the issue to them of Tithe Redemption Stock, guaranteed by the Government and repayable in 60 years. This Stock carried interest of 3% p.a. and could be bought and sold on the Stock Exchange. The interest received by tithe owners was slightly less than the tithes formerly payable, but they were relieved of the administrative burden of collection and bad debts. At the same time the liability of lay tithe owners for repairs to the chancel of the Church was extinguished, with a proportionate part of their Tithe Redemption Stock being allotted to the diocesan authorities.

Thus ended the Tithe system, which had been with us in this country for at least 1,200 years.

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Until the early fourteenth century High Littleton was a rectory, with the incumbent enjoying the tithes. On 15th July 1310 Gilbert AUMERY gave the advowson of High Littleton to the Abbey of Keynsham. In 1322 the appropriation of the rectory and tithes was sanctioned by Bishop DROKENSFORD, to help augment the Abbey's income, which had been much reduced as a result of its lands in Ireland and Wales suffering from floods and pestilence. The Royal Licence approving the transfer was dated 1328.

For more than two hundred years the Abbey of Keynsham received the tithes of High Littleton, but following its dissolution a Grant in Fee was made on 20th June 1544 to William ROSEWELL of Dunkerton of the rectory and tithes of High Littleton. The tithes remained in the ROSEWELL family until 18th June 1591, when Thomas ROSEWELL and his son William sold the rectory and tithes to Thomas MILWARD alias HODGES.

On 25th March 1693, Thomas HODGES sold to Thomas DANDO the tithes of corn, hay, wood and all other tithes Great and Small in Hallatrow. Thomas DANDO, or his son of the same name, married Joyce DYKE c.1700 and lived at Brick House, Hallatrow. They had a daughter Joyce, who married John JAMES c.1734, and when Thomas DANDO died in 1755, his estate, including the Hallatrow tithes, passed to her. Ownership of the tithes remained in the JAMES family thereafter.

The High Littleton tithes stayed in the HODGES family until the death of George HODGES in 1761. Under his will, George HODGES left the rectory and tithes in trust for the benefit of his grandchildren, all of whom were the children of his daughter Sarah, wife of Jacob MOGG. Jacob MOGG's grand daughter, Sarah Hodges MOGG married John REES-MOGG in 1841 and the High Littleton tithes duly descended to that family. In 1878 Eliza Amy REES-MOGG, daughter of John and Sarah, married Christopher William Moore GREENHILL of Puriton Manor and so the tithes passed to the GREENHILL family.

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LOCAL EXAMPLES OF ITEMS REFERRED TO IN THE GENERAL HISTORY OF TITHES

QUAKERS OPPOSITION TO PAYING TITHES

The Quakers' opposition to the payment of tithes can be judged from an extract of the minutes of Hallatrow monthly meeting of 18th March 1668/9, viz:

"That Friends doe further thinke meete that Richard HILL & John HILL doe give forth a paper to condemne the payment of Tythes, as formerly advised by friends declaring their resolutions for time to come to stand to truth's testimony in that behalfe, & this Friends perswade even for their owne good in truth, & for the clearing of all aspersions cast thereon."

Richard HILL, who owned most of the Manor of Hallatrow, was obviously in a moral dilemma. The reason for his slowness to publish a paper condemning the payment of tithes becomes clear in the following extracts from the minutes of Ilchester monthly meeting.

"Friends judging it not clear and well the payment of Richard HILL's Tythes, and there being aspersions and reproach cast upon truth touching the payment thereof, and his going out of prison, as if there were hypocrisy and deceit it is therefore thought meet he give them a true account . . . and cleare himselfe if he can for truth requires playne dealing, And friends are unsatisfyed touching his former silence and not giving forth a testimony . . . and his now hasting out of Towne . . . and would not stay to the meeting And they expect an account from him att the next quarterly meeting . . . for he hath gone out of Towne and hath left a stinke and ill savour behind him . . ."

NOTES ON THE VALUATION OF TITHES

The following notes were written in the backs of two books into which Mr. T.O. BENNETT, Land Surveyor of Bruton copied in 1825, details of the 1802 Survey of High Littleton and Hallatrow. BENNETT had been commissioned by the Vestry to produce an updated survey of the parish and make a new Poor Rate.

As to High Littleton:

Gen'l Remarks

The Tithe is estimated at it's full value; if let to the Occupiers there sho'd be deducted the expenses of collecting, which will be abo't one fourth of the value of the vicarial Tithe. The straw will pay the expense of housing the Corn and carrying to market.

Rich'd PARSONS 1805.

Mr. MOGG's remarks

The above remark is to be understood thus: if the Impropiator calculate his tithe with the Occupier of Lands from the Stock that is kept on the Lands, that is from the value of the tithe of the Stock, one fourth sho'd be deducted, which in nineteen cases out of twenty will amount to ab't one seventh of the rack rent or rather ann'l value, which ought to be guided by the quantum of produce arising f'm those lands to maintain Stock.

The vicarial and rectorial Tythe of grass land is estimated at abo't one seventh of the rack rent; The Corn Tithes at about one fourth of the rack rent. The poor rate is calculated to be p'd by the Occupiers both of the land and the tythe. Cow white is a modus, for it wo'd reduce the vicarial & rectorial tythe of grass land to ab't one twelfth of the rack rent.

On the reverse of this page, written in pencil, are notes made by BENNETT during the course of his survey and valuation of the Parish.

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BENNETT attributed the following Annual Values to the Tithes in his 1825 Valuation:

Trustees of J. G. MOGG Esq. & Mrs. Jacob MOGG, in trust for Miss MOGG - The Great & Small Tithes of the Tithing of High Littleton, with the exception of the Lands of the late Jacob MOGG sen. Esq., which are let tithe free. It is considered that there is a modus for cow white [*milk*]. £64 - -

Messrs. Tho. & Jno. JAMES - The Great & Small Tithes of Hallatrow Tithing, supposing there to be a modus for cow white.
£85 - -

Notes in BENNETT's Survey reveal the basis of the above valuations, viz:

"Hallatrow Tithes produce, according to Mr. JAMES's Acc. shewn to me the 17th Oct. 1825 £128. 7. 0" - "take them at about two thirds", and with regard to High Littleton: "These Tithes produce ab't 98£ a year - taken at abo't two thirds".

A Bill from Tho's MILES, Solicitor of Ston Easton, refers to "Mr. BENNETT having difficulty in ascert'g particulars of the Tithes, attending at Mr. Thomas JAMES's with him and afterwards on Mrs. George MOGG, who shewed us their books and sundry papers relating to the Tythes".

No doubt from the latter visit, BENNETT noted the following "From Mr. MOGG's papers" -

SALEABLE VALUE OF HALLATROW TITHES

A notice in Felix Farley's Bristol Journal of September 6th 1856, advertised the sale of nine Lots of freehold property in Hallatrow, including Lot 9 "The Rent Charge in Lieu of Tithes, within the Tything or District of Hallatrow, which was fixed by the Agreement duly confirmed by the Tithe Commissioners, at the yearly Sum of £135." Mr. Joseph HILL was to sell these by auction at High Littleton Inn on Wednesday 17th September at Five O'clock in the afternoon.

In the event, Lot 9 was not sold, but a private offer was subsequently received for the Tithes. A bill from Messrs. J. & W. REES MOGG & PERRIN, solicitors to the Estate of John Hill JAMES deceased, refers on Nov. 16 1856 to "Attending Mr. Joseph HILL in reference to Mr. LEWIS' offer of £1,750 for the Tithe commutation rent charge, when he thought that the lowest price for the Tithe rent charge should be £2,000, and on the same date "Writing to Mr. LEWIS that £2,000 was the lowest price for the Tithes." Mr. LEWIS obviously declined to increase his offer and the Tithes remained in the JAMES family.

CERTIFICATE OF REDEMPTION OF TITHE RENTCHARGE UNDER THE TITHE ACTS, 1836 to 1918 [*High Littleton*]

Whereas certain Tithe Rentcharges amounting in the whole to Three pounds three shillings and five pence have been apportioned under the Tithe Acts 1836 to 1918 upon certain lands in the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset as set forth in the Schedule hereto,

And Whereas the said Rentcharges being redeemable under the said Acts, due application was made for the redemption thereof according to the provisions of the said Acts,

And Whereas the amount of the consideration money payable on such redemption has been duly determined to be the sum set out in the Schedule thereto,

And Whereas all the provisions of the said Acts, in relation thereto having been complied with, an Order was duly made under the said Acts directing and determining that the said Rentcharges should be redeemed by the payment of the sum set out in the Schedule to such Order and also set out in the said Schedule hereto.

And Whereas Reginald Thomason GOULD of Glastonbury in the said County, Solicitor and Anthony GREENHILL of Puriton Manor, in the said County, Esquire being entitled to three equal undivided fourth parts of the said Rentcharges in fee simple in possession as Trustees of a Marriage Settlement bearing date the 19th day of August 1878 [*Marriage of Eliza Amy REES-MOGG and Christopher William Moore GREENHILL*], the redemption money in respect thereof was paid on the date specified in the Schedule hereto to the said Reginald Thomason GOULD and Anthony GREENHILL and Eliza Amy GREENHILL the Wife of Christopher William Moore GREENHILL of Puritan (*sic*) Manor aforesaid,

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being absolutely entitled to the remaining equal undivided fourth part of the said Rentcharges in fee simple in possession, or enabled to dispose of the fee simple in possession therein independently of the provisions of the said Acts, the redemption money in respect thereof was also paid on the date specified in the Schedule hereto to the said Eliza Amy GREENHILL,

Now the Minister of Agriculture & Fisheries, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Ministry of Agriculture & Fisheries Acts 1889 to 1919 and the Tithe Acts 1836 to 1918 HEREBY CERTIFIES that the said Rentcharges have been redeemed.

IN WITNESS whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture & Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty fourth day of August Nineteen hundred and twenty two.

Whereas certain Tithe Rentcharges amounting in the whole to Eleven shillings and sixpence have been apportioned under the Tithe Acts 1836 to 1925 upon certain lands in the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset as set forth in the Schedule hereto,

And Whereas the said Rentcharges being redeemable under the said Acts, due application was made for the redemption thereof according to the provisions of the said Acts,

And Whereas the amount of the consideration money payable on such redemption has been duly determined to be the sum set out in the Schedule thereto,

And Whereas all the provisions of the said Acts, in relation thereto having been complied with, an Order was duly made under the said Acts directing and determining that the said Rentcharge should be redeemed by the payment of the sum set out in the Schedule to such Order and also set out in the said Schedule hereto,

And Whereas Thomas Maurice JAMES of Sutton Valence School, Maidstone in the County of Kent, schoolmaster, being absolutely entitled to the said Rentcharges in fee simple in possession or enabled to dispose of the fee simple in possession therein independently of the provisions of the said Acts, the redemption money in respect thereof was paid on the date specified in the Schedule hereto to the said Thomas Maurice JAMES,

Now the Minister of Agriculture & Fisheries, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Ministry of Agriculture & Fisheries Acts 1889 to 1919 and the Tithe Acts 1836 to 1925 HEREBY CERTIFIES that the said Rentcharges have been redeemed.

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TITHE AWARD - ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

APPORITIONMENT of the Rentcharge in lieu of Tithes in the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset.

WHEREAS an Agreement for the Commutation of Tithes in the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset was on the twenty eighth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine [28th Aug 1839] confirmed by the Tithe Commissioners for England and Wales of which Agreement, with the Schedule thereunto annexed, the following is a copy.

the several persons, owners of land within the said parish, by whom or by whose agents, duly authorized in that behalf, these presents are executed and the interest of which Landowners in the lands of the said parish, is not less than two thirds of the Lands therein subject to Tithes, of the first part,

John George MOGG of Farrington Gurney in the said County of Somerset, Esquire and Sarah Hodges MOGG of the City of Bath, Spinster, impropiators as Tenants in Common of all the Tithes arising within the said parish of High Littleton not intended to be hereby merged, except the Tithing of Hallatrow, of the second part,

John REES-MOGG of Cholwell House in the said County, Gentleman, Joseph HILL of Paulton in the same County, Gentleman and Mary JAMES of High Littleton aforesaid, widow, impropiators as joint tenants of all the Tithes arising and payable within the said Tything of Hallatrow and not intended to be hereinafter merged, of the third part;

the said John George MOGG, owner of part of the lands hereinafter described and the Tithes thereof, of the fourth part,

the said Sarah Hodges MOGG, owner of part of the lands hereinafter described and the Tithes thereof, of the fifth part,

George Treweeke SCOBELL of High Littleton aforesaid, Esquire, owner of other part of the Tithes of the said Parish, of the sixth part,

Robert COLLINGS of Farrington Gurney aforesaid, farmer, owner of part of the Tithes of the said Tything of Hallatrow, of the seventh part,

Richard EVANS of Timsbury aforesaid, farmer and owner of part of the Tithes of the said Parish, of the eighth part

and the Reverend Henry Hodges MOGG of Ston Easton in the said county, Clerk and vicar of the same parish and as such entitled to the endowed annual sum hereinafter mentioned, of the ninth part.

Now they, the said John George MOGG, Sarah Hodges MOGG, George Treweeke SCOBELL, Robert COLLINGS and Richard EVANS, do hereby severally and respectively declare it to

HIGH LITTLETON AND HALLATROW TITHES

be his and her will and intent, certified by their respective signature and seal hereunto annexed, that the said Tithes shall henceforth be absolutely merged and extinguished in the Freehold and inheritance of the same lands and premises respectively. And it is hereby agreed that the annual sum of seventy seven pounds and seven shillings [*£77 7s. 0d.*] by way of Rentcharge (subject to the provisions of the said Act and also to the payment of an annual endowed sum of thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence [*£13 6s. 8d.*] to the vicar of the said vicarage of High Littleton aforesaid) shall be paid in equal moieties to the said John George MOGG and Sarah Hodges MOGG, their heirs and assigns, instead of all the Tithes, as well great as small, of the lands of the said parish subject to Tithes, except the Tithes of the lands hereinbefore stated to belong to the said John George MOGG, Sarah Hodges MOGG, George Treweeke SCOBELL, Robert COLLINGS and Richard EVANS and except the Tithes of the lands situate and being within the said Tithing or District of Hallatrow and instead of all moduses and prescriptive and customary payments in lieu thereof. And it is hereby further agreed that the annual sum of one hundred and thirty five pounds [*£135*] by way of Rentcharge, subject to the provision of the said Act, shall be paid to the said John REES-MOGG, Joseph HILL and Mary JAMES, their heirs and assigns, instead of all the Tithes, as well great as small, of those lands of the said parish subject to Tithes, which are within the Tithing or District of Hallatrow, except the lands, the Tithes of which are hereinbefore declared to be merged by the said Robert COLLINGS and instead of all moduses and compositions, real and prescriptive and customary payments in lieu thereof, a summary description of all the lands in the said parish is contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

And it is further agreed that the lands included in this agreement shall be discharged from the payment of Tithes from the first day of January following the confirmation of the apportionment of the Rentcharges hereinbefore agreed on and that the first payment of such Rentcharges respectively shall be made or be recoverable on the expiration of six calendar months from the time from which the said lands are discharged from the payment of Tithes.

In testimony whereof the said parties to these presents or their respective agents thereunto, duly authorized in their names and on their behalf, have to these presents subscribed and set their respective hands and seals.

HIGH LITTLETON AND HALLATROW TITHES

The Tithe Map has been traced by the transcriber in twenty four sections, which are reproduced on the pages that follow. Every property in the parish is shown with it's Name, Schedule number and name of the primary occupier. To avoid losing any part of the overall map, each section overlaps slightly with the adjacent section. On each section of map is indicated by the words "part of -", the numbers of the map sections which overlap each border. The numbers and descriptions below are repeated on the respective map sections.

11. North east part of Langford's Lane from the back of High Littleton House to the river.
12. High Littleton Hill and junction with Langford's Lane.
13. South side of Langford's Lane to the river and fields to the north of Hallatrow Road.
14. Hart's Lane, The Triangle, Hallatrow Bridge and Montvale.
15. Hallatrow Road from The Triangle towards Paulton, including Butts Lane.
16. South side of Paulton end of Hallatrow Road, including Hallatrow Down Farm and Farrington Road.
17. Fields to the south east of the river, between Hart's Lane and Temple Bridge.
18. Main street of Hallatrow south from Manor Farm, including Combe Lane.
19. Fields to the south of Butts Lane and east of Combe Lane.
20. Bristol Road from Temple Bridge to White Cross and top of Green Lane.
21. Fields north east of White Cross.
22. Fields at South Slade Bottom adjoining Farrington Gurney boundary.
23. Red House Farm and boundary with Cameley and Farrington Gurney.
24. Bottom of Green Lane and fields to the east up to the Farrington Gurney boundary.
