

HALLATROW SURVEY 1802

The same basis for assessing Poor Rates in High Littleton had been in operation for many, many years and by the turn of the century there were quite a few anomalies, which resulted in some ratepayers paying less than they should, to the detriment of the others, who were left to bear more than their fair proportion of the rate. High Littleton tithing had had a survey as recently as 1793, which provided up to date details of owners, occupiers, acreage of land, state of cultivation etc. This was commissioned privately by Lady JONES rather than the parish Vestry and did not include Hallatrow tithing (other than what she owned there). Clearly a survey of Hallatrow was needed before new rate assessments for the whole parish could be considered. The Vestry were not over anxious to spend money on such a task and inevitably dragged its feet. It was only a matter of time before someone brought the matter to a head.

Take Notice that I the undersigned, being an Occupier of Lands in the Tithing of Hallatrow, within the parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset, do intend to enter and try an appeal at the next general Quarter Sessions of the peace, to be holden in and for the said County of Somerset, from and against a Rate intituled "An Assessment for the necessary Relief of the poor and for other purposes in the several acts of parliament mentioned relating to the poor for the parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset, made and assessed the 13th Day of May 1801". And I do further give you notice that my objections to the said Rate and my reasons for appealing therefrom, are that the same at the Time of the making thereof, was, and still is, unequal and partial, for that my Lands within the said Tithing and parish and in the said Rate respectively named and assessed, are overcharged and rated beyond the equal proportion with other Lands and Tenements within the said Tithing and parish and in particular that they are rated beyond an equal proportion with an Estate called Broomhill, belonging to the said George MOGG.

Take Notice that I the undersigned, being an occupier of Lands in the Tithing of Hallatrow, within the Parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset, do intend to enter and try an appeal at the next general Quarter Sessions of the peace, to be holden in and for the said County of Somerset, from and against a Rate intituled "An Assessment for the necessary Relief of the poor and for other purposes in the several acts of parliament mentioned relating to the poor for the parish of High Littleton in the County of Somerset, made and assessed the 13th Day of May 1801" and I do further give you notice that my objections to the said Rate and my reasons for appealing therefrom, are that the same at the Time of the making thereof, was, and still is, unequal and partial, for that my Lands within the said Tithing and parish and in the said rate respectively named and assessed, are overcharged and rated beyond the equal proportion with other Lands and Tenements within the said Tithing and parish and in particular that they are rated beyond an equal proportion with certain Estates belonging to the said George MOGG and described in the said Rate as "late HODGES", And for that certain Coaleries or Coalworks called Mearnes, situate within the said Tithing and Parish are omitted to be rated or assessed in and by the said Rate.

Walter BENNETT, who farmed 34 acres in Hallatrow, clearly stirred the Vestry into action.

Minutes of a Vestry held on 24th November 1801.

Present - Geo. MOGG, Jno. PURNELL, R'd LANGFORD, Tho's Ames HILL, W'm DRURY, George TUCKER, L. LANSDOWN, Jesse SAGE, John SAGE, Walter BENNET, John COOK, John BLINMAN, W'm SKEY, Mary FLOWER, William Jones BURDETT and Jacob MOGG.

The meeting was held for the purpose of making a new Poor Rate for the support and maintenance of the poor of this parish.

Resolved that a Surveyor be immediately employed to measure such part of the parish as has not already been measured and that, after the exact contents of the whole parish are ascertained, a rate be made of 1d. per acre on such admeasurement. Also resolved that all expenses attending such admeasurement and completing such new rate be paid by the Overseer out of the rates.

Mr. Jeremiah CRUSE, a Surveyor, was duly appointed to survey and map Hallatrow Tithing and, at the same time, update the 1793 terrier for High Littleton Tithing, following which he was to recommend a new rate. Overseers' Accounts record a payment in June 1802 "to Jno. STICKLER for attending Mr. CRUES in measuring the land" and in September 1803 £37 14/- "to Mr. CRUSE for his bill for surveying and mapping Hallatrow". In two documents of 1820, Richard LANGFORD describes land by reference to "Messrs. SMITH & CRUSE map of Hallatrow made in 1802" and "SMITH & CRUSE's Plan of 1802". Jeremiah CRUSE and William SMITH, who surveyed High Littleton in 1793, were in practice together in Bath in the first few years of the nineteenth century.

HALLATROW SURVEY 1802

The map and terrier of Hallatrow, which was produced in 1802 by Mr. CRUSE, following his survey, was copied in 1825 by Mr. T.O. BENNETT, who added various notes of his own (shown below in square brackets) to facilitate his survey in that year. This is most useful in reconciling the various land holdings at the two dates. In BENNETT's copy, which has been transcribed hereunder, the columns for "Computed Acres" were not totalled. Any additions or comments by the transcriber have been shown in italics.
