The chairman gave a detailed account of the workings of the parish council during the past year, a period which had seen the making up of Greyfield Road & the long awaited reforming of the parish boundaries & repairs to the Batch corner. The latter items had been subjects that had been discussed & pressed for, for many, many years & now, at last, something had been achieved & he felt sure that they were greatly appreciated.

#### Accounts

The audited accounts were presented & adopted. The past year's accounts were also presented to the meeting.

## Mary JONES' Charity

The minutes of the meeting of trustees was read &, on the motion of Mr KIMBER, the names of the recipients were taken as read.

#### District Councillor's Report

Mr A.H. GORE gave a detailed account of his work as District Councillor during the past year & answered many questions relating to the R.D.C., chiefly about housing.

## Adoption of the Street Lighting Acts

The chairman outlined the basic details of this act & read a letter recieved (*sic*) from 27 parish[*i*]oners, requesting the Parish Council should consider the adoption of Street Lighting. He stated that his council had gone into the matter most thoroughly & had decided to send a phamplet (*sic*) on the subject to each householder. The following details were then put to the meeting:

Cost of light(en)ing the parish with 34 lamps & installation costs would be approx. £769 [£796 intended]; a further £119 yearly would then be required for electricity & maintenance.

To do this, a levy of 1/- rate would be needed forthwith; this in 2 years would bring in approx. £720, leaving a balance of £76 to be found, to meet the initial cost, & of course there would be £119 per year to find for electric/it/y & maintenance for 2 years or, at least, as from when the lighting was installed.

It has been suggested that these latter items could be raised by voluntary efforts but the Parish Council had discussed this matter fully & had reached the unanimous decision that this was not practical & had decided, if the lighting Act was adopted, all costs must be borne by the rates, in the usual way. However, should any person decide to raise money voluntar[il]y, this money could be accepted & the rates reduced accordingly.

There was a full discussion on this subject from the floor of the meeting & the chairman answered many questions. Eventually, it was proposed that the subject should be held over for 12 months. After a vote, this proposition was defeated. A vote was then taken for or against adopting the act, the voting being 62 for & 62 against. The proposition being lost, as it required a  $^2$ /<sub>3</sub>rds majority. The tellers were the clerk of the Clutton R.D.C. & the clerk of the Parish Council.

## Any other business

Questions were asked about the doctors' surgery hours & times in the village & it was proposed that the Doctors be written to, requesting the consideration of an evening surgery two nights weekly.

Mr F. HOOKE proposed a vote of thanks to Mr GORE for his ex[c]ellent work for the parish & this concluded the business.

Arising from the minutes, the clerk read a letter from the R.D.C., relating to the policy on condemmed (sic) houses, which stated that the onus of clearing the sites etc. fell on the owner; failure to do so would mean the council could demolish & charge the costs to the owner.

## Correspondence

Arising from the correspondence, it was decided not to take any action re the King George's Fund for Sailors.

## **Burial Grounds**

The chairman drew the attention to members of the recent Ministry order, relating to the maintenance of burial grounds, stating that the matter had been discussed with the clerk of the R.D.C. & there seemed no doubt that we could help in this respect. After discussing the matter, it was prop. by H. BRICE & sec. by H.T. HUNN, that up to £20 be spent in cleaning the cemetary (*sic*), providing the Church Council agreed. The chairman & the clerk were empowered to obtain the labour for this project.

#### **Footpaths**

The question of cleaning footpaths was discussed & it was prop. by M. BROOKS & sec. by H. BRICE, that the following footpaths be cleaned: (a) at the Batch, (b) New Rd. & (c) at Hallatrow. It being decided that the chairman & clerk obtain labour to do the two in the village & Mrs WRIGHT at Hallatrow.

It was prop. that a vote of thanks be tendered to Mr V. SAGE, for caring for the path at Hallatrow.

## Any other business

Mr M. BROOKS raised the question of water accumulating (sic) in Mr C. MAGGS' garden &, after a discussion, it was prop. that the clerk write the R.D.C., requesting that this source of trouble be investigated again.

The next meeting was arranged for the 1st Mon. in Sept. & this concluded the business.

Arising from a complaint from a resident, it was prop. by H. BRICE, to go into the question of house numbering, Mrs WRIGHT & Mr HUNN volunteering to assist in this matter.

Arising from the correspondence, it was prop. that Mrs WRIGHT should contact Mr J. LAWRENCE, with a view to obtaining material for a publication & official guide, relating to historical interests in the parish.

The chairman stated that a letter had been sent to Master J. BRIMBLE, on the occasion of his selection for England Schoolboys sports.

## Chairman's Report

Mr A.H. GORE gave the meeting a detailed account of the work done by the Parish Council during the past year, stating that they had been pleased to have helped the Church by providing funds to have the cemetary (sic) cleaned

He also said that there was still hope of a sewage scheme for the village in the not too distant future.

Dealing with Rural District Council matters, he stated that he was pleased that, now the Eastover council houses were nearing completion, plans were being made for the er(r)ection of four single bedroom type for elderly people.

## Any other Business

A long discussion was held, in connection with the need for provision of an extention (sic) to the burial ground. It being estimated that the present cemetary (sic) would last from three to five years, the onus would then fall on the parish to provide a burial ground. Complaints were recieved (sic), regarding the parking of lorries at Eastover & the nuisance caused be [by] the drivers revving them up in the early hours of the morning & it was proposed that the matter be taken up with the RDC

Mr A. EVANS, having been co-opted to fill a vacancy on the council, was given a welcome by all members & thanked for accepting office.

The date of the next meeting was left to the descretion (sic) of the chairman & the clerk & this concluded the business.

Arising from the minutes, the chairman informed the meeting that the District Auditor had notified the Parish Council that the following minute prop. & sec. at the last annual meeting was contrary to the act: "It was prop. that the council should accumalate (*sic*) funds for this project (provision of a burial ground) by the levy of a four penny rate for three years, providing the church would accept the said burial ground & administer as at present." Mr A. MAGGS the proposed & Mr H.T. HUNN seconded "That, in accordance with the Auditor's wishes, this minute be res[c]inded, as this method of dealing with the matter does not comply with section 10 of the act, inasmuch the Parish Council could contribute in this way towards maintaining a burial ground but not providing the same." The proposition was carried unanimously. The chairman further stated that the parish council were still concerned with providing an additional burial ground & one suggested site had already been inspected, though no decision on the purchase or the administration had yet been made.

## Chairman's Report

The chairman gave a detailed report, both of the work of the parish council & of his efforts, on behalf of the parish, on the Rural District Council, dealing with a number of subjects, including the probable sewage scheme, maintainan[c]e (sic) of footpaths, the council's fight against the closure of the local railway, the unsucces[s]ful attempt to obtain a more frequent bus service.

Mention was also made of the loss to the village by the death, during the past year, of Mr Bart. CARTER, who had done so much for the village in past years. The meeting fully concurring with these sentiments.

In conclusion, he welcomed Mr A. EVANS to the council in place of Mr B. FORD, who had resigned & thanked the council for supporting him during the year & the parish[i] oners for attending the meeting.

## Mary JONES' Charity

The minutes of Mary JONES' Charity were read & the names of the recipients were taken as read & the trustees thanked for their work in connection with this charity.

#### Accounts

The clerk presented the accounts to the meeting & they were adopted & a vote of thanks was accorded to Mrs WRIGHT for collecting the garden rents.

#### Any other business

Questions were asked regarding the advertising of the meeting, the clerk stating that notices were posted in the village & it was advertised in the local press & this was felt to be adequate.

The meeting proposed a most sincere & hearty vote of thanks to the chairman for his ex[c] ellent work on behalf of the parish & this concluded the business.

# Present

## Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting were read & agreed to.

#### Matters arising

Arising from the minutes, the chairman stated that he had inspected the wire boundary of the path leading to the Legion Hut, in the company of Mr CLARK & suggested that no action need be taken, pending the proposed widening of the said path; he had also discussed the problem at the Batch with the District Surveyor, who had agreed to endeaver (sic) to effect alterations & to place the proposed improvements in next year's estimates, provided the householder (Mr SHEPPARD) agrees.

## Correspondence

Arising from a request from Mr B. AVERY, it was agreed to ask the respective companies their views on painting electric & telegraph poles white, in cases where they are sited on the pavement & liable to cause obstruction to pedestrians.

An invitation from the British Legion, to attend the Remembrance Service, was read & it was agreed to leave the decision to individual members.

Correspondence, relating to Charities administered by councils, was discussed & it was decided to reply, stating that this council are interested in the proposals outlined but wish to consider the detailed arrangements before deciding to participate.

Letters re bus fares & time tables were read & the contents considered satisfactory.

Members disagreed with the views expressed by the Postal Authorities re the provision of a post box & the clerk was instructed to press the matter further.

Correspond[en]ce from the Mendip Moral Welfare & from Fire Prevention Soc. were passed to Mrs M. WRIGHT, in the hope that the Women's Institute could deal with these matters.

#### Mary JONES' Charity

It was decided to post the usual notices relating to this charity & to hold the annual meeting on Dec. 11th or 12th.

#### Any other business

Complaints, re overhanging hedges at Mearns, were discussed & the clerk instructed to write to the farmer concerned.

Mr L.T. CLEAVES raised the question of adopting the Street Light(en)ing Acts &, after a discussion & on a motion by Mr G. BLINMAN, it was agreed to place the matter on the agenda of the next meeting.

The date of the next meeting was left to the discretion of the chairman & the clerk & this concluded the business.

## A parish council meeting was held in the school on Monday January 22nd 1962.

## Present

Mr G. BLINMAN sent his apologies for non-attendance.

#### Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting were read & agreed to.

### Matters Arising

Arising from the minutes, the chairman stated that he had toured the village with a representative from the Postal Authority &, at a later date, communication had been received, stating that they could not consider the provision of a post box on the Batch.

Regarding requests to the Post Office Telephones & S.W.E.B., to paint poles sited on the pavement, the former replied, stating that the council could paint their poles, if they so desired, whilst the latter stated their poles could not be painted, owing to being treated with creosote. It was then proposed that Mr A. EVANS be contacted, with a view to attaching white wooden strips on the dangerous poles in the High St.

Arising from the discussion at the previous meeting, on the question of adopting the Street Light(en)ing Act, the chairman stated the [that] he had been in contact with the S.W.E.B. & a quotation for lighting the parish was awaited from them.

## **Burial Ground**

The chairman gave details of a meeting with Mr WILTSHIRE, at which various sites for a burial ground had been suggested & that he (the chairman) thought it possible that Mr WILTSHIRE might be agreeable to giving the council land at Langford's Lane; however, as Mr L.J. FILER was not present, the matter was held in abeyance.

### Sewage

The plans, for the proposed sewage scheme for the parish, were studied & considered satisfactory. Mr M. BROOKS enquired as to when the project would commence & was informed that it was impossible to say but it would be some considerable time.

### Finance & Precept, Cheques

The estimates for the financial year 1962/63 were discussed & it was prop. by Mr S. ORMAN & sec. by Mr H.T/J/. BRICE, that the estimated rate be that of 3d. & the R.D.C. notified accordingly.

It was further agreed to precept for £40 & approval for the signature of the following cheques was recieved (sic): S.W.E.B. £1. 7. 5, A. EVANS £3.11. 0d., Somerset Education Com. £1. 0. 0, N.E.M. £1.10. 0d.

## Cpt. SCOBELL Deceased

Information, relating to the will of the late Cpt. SCOBELL, was presented to the meeting, the solicitors intim(id)ating that, in addition to the £50 earmarked for the council, there was the possibility of a gift of £180, this being the asses[s]ment of the property at Mearns. This information was received with satisfaction by all members.

# Correspondence

Correspondence, relating to an appeal by the Oxford Committee for Famine Relief, was read & it was decided to take no action.

A letter from the Bristol Bus Company was read, this being notification of the fact that arrangements had been made to connect service 136, with service 59 from Bath, at the Butcher's Arms, Farmborough & it was agreed that these arrangements were working satisfactor[il]y at present.

#### Any other business

Mr H.T. HUNN raised the question of a petition, relating to Greyfield road, & presented by him to the clerk, & asked why this had not been dealt with in the correspondence. The chairman replied, stating that he considered the methods used to present the petition were unconstitutional & was waiting for the matter to be brought up under any other business. This did not meet with the approval of the council [This sentence added later]. Mr HUNN proceeded to raise the matter [altered from - This Mr HUNN proceeded to do] & he was supported by Mr S.J. ORMAN, in being of the opinion that the condition of Greyfield Rd. was a disgrase (sic). After holding a discussion on the subject, it was agreed to write to the contracter (sic) & the chairman agreed to keep members informed of any information or developments.

Mr H.T[J]. BRICE raised the complaints of parish[i]oners re water accumalation (sic) on the footpath between Eastover & Southover, re waste land at Eastover, which tenants wish to take over as their front gardens & trouble with a stop cock at Greyfield corner. The chairman replied that he would take these matters up with the heads of the departments concerned on the R.D.C.

The clerk stated that the council's notice board had been er(r)ected & suggested that Mr A. JAMES be asked to apply the appropriate lettering on the board & this was agreed to.

Mrs M. WRIGHT raised the question of the stopping of a footpath at Hallatrow & the clerk stated that he would seek further into this matter &, if necessary, write to the farmer concerned.

The next meeting was arranged for March 5th at 7.30 p.m. & this concluded the business.

The chairman Mr A.H. GORE, during the discussion on Greyfield Rd., gave notice of his interest in matters appertaining to Greyfield Rd.

Arising from the minutes, it was agreed that, the application of white strips to a telegraph pole, was satisfactory but it was decided not to deal with any more at present.

The clerk stated that the obstruction to a footpath, at Hallatrow, had been removed & trouble with the stop cock at Greyfield corner dealt with, whilst the chairman had informed him the question of footpath repairs & waste land, both at Eastover, were being dealt with by the R.D.C. officials.

# **Street Lighting**

A quotation for lighting the parish with 71 lamps, at a cost of £1,780, together with £88 app. maintenance costs, was discussed & the maps, showing positions of lights, perused; after discussing the matter, it was proposed by Mr G. BLINMAN & secon[d]ed by Mr H.T[J]. BRICE, that a special meeting, to go thoroughly into the question of Street Lighting, should be held on Monday March 19th at 7.30 p.m., this being carried unanimously. Cpt. SCOBELL's Legacy

The chairman read a further letter from the solicitors re this matter & the clerk stated that the solicitors had requested the Mary JONES' Charity Book. After a discussed [discussion], the clerk was instructed to ask for the return of the said book & it was prop. by Mr H.T[J]. BRICE that, any monies accruing from the will of Cpt. SCOBELL, should not be made over to Mary JONES' Charity, unless approval of this council be granted.

#### <u>Finance</u>

Correspondence from the R.D.C., stating that "it is not proposed to levy an additional rate for your parish, as there is a sufficient balance in hand to meet your estimated precept", was brought to the notice of the meeting. Members were dissatisfied with this notification & it was prop. by Mr G. BLINMAN & sec. by Mr H.T[J]. BRICE, That the clerk write the Rating Auth., requesting the council be notified [of] the exact amount of credit held by them.

The following cheques were agreed to & made payable: C.W. SHEARN £36. 0s. 5d., H. STYLES £5, S.W.E.B. £1.11s.10, A. EVANS £1. 7s. 6d.

# Correspondence

A letter from the haulage contractors, regarding Greyfield Rd., was read & discussed & it was agreed that no further action was nec(c)essary.

# Any other business

Mr M. BROOKS raised a complaint re a pavement subsiding, after repairs by the Bristol Water Works. The clerk was instructed to deal with this matter.

Mr C.G. CHURCH raised the question of the problem of elderly people in council houses on the Batch. Members agreeing that this was a real problem, appertaining to many old people living alone but they felt that nothing could be done towards having a warden or some other kind of aid on this particular site &, on the proposition by Mr L.T. CLEAVES, sec. by Mr C.G. CHURCH, the clerk was instructed to write to the R.D.C., requesting that, when a further allocation of council houses was granted to this parish, consideration be given to the wishes of this parish council, in respect of providing old people's dwellings with the provision of a warden. Mr H.T[J]. BRICE raised a complaint of a footpath at Gooseherd being inacces[s]able & the clerk stated he would deal with the matter.

The chairman drew attention to the activity of the Mendip Moral Welfare Ass. & gave a brief resume of the functions. However, the meeting did not commit(t) its self to supporting this Association. This concluded the business.

## **PARISH COUNCILLORS**

The normal period of office of a parish councillor was three years and in his or her year of election the newly elected councillor took office from 15th April. From the inception of the Parish Council in 1894, High Littleton elected six councillors but in 1946 the Council was enlarged to nine members. Because of the war no Council elections were held in 1940 and 1943 and so the Council elected in 1937 (with the exception of one member who died), continued in office for nine years. From 1958 the Council was empowered to elect thirteen members but chose not to elect more than nine.

# **CLERK**

William Henry MARTIN was appointed as Clerk on 27 July 1896 and held that office until his death on 8 April 1934.

He was succeeded by Gilbert Brice CLEAVES, who was appointed Clerk on 17 April 1934, having first resigned as a Councillor.

In 1953 CLEAVES announced his intention of retiring at the end of the year 1953/4, by which time he would have completed 50 years service as Councillor and Clerk.

Clarence William Frederick SHEARN, resigned as a Councillor on 1 June 1953, in order that he could take over the Clerk's duties from CLEAVES. For ten months SHEARN carried out the Clerk's duties, ostensibly as Assistant to CLEAVES. CLEAVES retired on 5 April 1954, whereupon SHEARN became Clerk officially and remained as such for many years thereafter.

## **SCHOOL MANAGERS**

Gilbert Brice CLEAVES was School Manager from 18 July 1905 until 17 April 1934, when he resigned as a member of the Council to become Clerk.

Alfred George SALMON was appointed School Manager in CLEAVES' stead on 17 April 1934 and held that position until 14 April 1937.

Gilbert Peter DANDO was School Manager from 14 April 1937 until his death on 15 Jan 1940.

Frederick James HOOKE was appointed in DANDO's stead on 14 Feb 1940 and continued through 1951, when it became necessary for the Council to appoint two members to the Management Committee.

On 19 Feb 1951 Herbert John BRICE was nominated to join HOOKE as the second Manager.

On 30 June 1952 Herbert John BRICE and Arthur James MAGGS were appointed the School Managers. They resigned on 23 May 1955, when Marjorie WRIGHT and Frederick James HOOKE were appointed to fill the vacancies.

On May 19 1958 Marjorie WRIGHT and Herbert Thomas HUNN were appointed School Managers.

On May 29 1961 Marjorie WRIGHT and Lawrence Tremblett CLEAVES were appointed School Managers for the 3 years ending June 1964.

## TRUSTEES OF MARY JONES' CHARITY

The Vicar of the day was an ex officio Trustee of the Charity. In addition, the Parish Council elected four Administering Trustees, who held office for four years. Every 2 years, two of the Administering Trustees retired and two more were appointed. Retiring Trustees were eligible for re-election. No elections were held during World War I. After World War I the normal pattern of electing Trustees was broken and they remained in office until replaced. In 1958 trustees were elected for a three year term.
